COURSE OUTLINE:

This course examines contemporary theoretical and ethnographic discussions relating to the human body, personhood, and identity. Topics covered will include social and cultural constructions of gender, cultural ideologies of sexuality, social inscriptions on the body, disability, and the body and death. This course will also examine cultural assumptions about the human body and what it means to be a "person" in non-Western societies.
