Course Description:

This course explores families and households from a gender perspective, using insights from sociology, anthropology, and interdisciplinary fields. We will begin by discussing what it means to be a family in different global contexts and examining family structures which challenge the normative nuclear family. We will explore family issues through a gendered lens and examine how gendered identities shape our family and household roles within the public and private sphere. Using both traditional and critical viewpoints, we will examine how gendered and sexual identities shape our experiences of family and household roles; and how these identities intersect with other identities (e.g. cultural, racial, and class identities) and societal institutions (e.g. workplace norms, available resources, and social policy). Additionally, we will examine how our lived experiences within the family system shape our gendered identities and our expectation of what it means to be a "good family member".

Format of Delivery:

It is expected that the course will primarily take place in person. This is subject to change based on university expectations/policies for the Fall 2022 semester.
